



Important Information regarding Medicare Part B Test Strips Preferred Products

Abbott Diabetes is the preferred manufacturer for blood glucose monitors and test strips for Blue Shield TotalDual Plan (HMO D-SNP), Blue Shield AdvantageOptimum Plan (HMO), and Blue Shield AdvantageOptimum Plan 1 (HMO).

FreeStyle® test strips (made by Abbott Diabetes) will not require prior authorization when obtained from a network pharmacy. Blue Shield has a quantity limit of 100 test strips and lancets per 90 days if you do not take insulin and a quantity limit of 300 test strips and lancets per 90 days if you do take insulin. You or your doctor will be required to submit a request via the Blue Shield pharmacy prior authorization process for test strips that are **not** FreeStyle or if you need to use more test strips and lancets.

If you are currently not using Freestyle test strips but would like to switch:

- 1. Talk with your doctor to find out if FreeStyle test strips will work for you.** You can also visit ChooseFreeStyle.com to learn more, or contact Abbott Diabetes Care Customer Care at **(800) 224-8892**.
- 2. Obtain a prescription from your doctor for FreeStyle test strips.** Please remember, you will also need a new prescription for a FreeStyle blood glucose monitor to use with your FreeStyle test strips. The FreeStyle blood glucose monitor is available at no cost. Bring this flyer to the pharmacy and provide them with the following information:

- 3. Fill your prescription before you run out of your current test strips.** This will give you time to learn how to use your new FreeStyle blood glucose monitor while you still have your current supplies on hand. Also, your new FreeStyle blood glucose monitor will require compatible FreeStyle test strips. Your old strips will not work with your new blood glucose monitor. - 4. In some cases, your doctor might think you need to continue using your current blood glucose monitor and test strips.** You or your doctor can submit a request via the Blue Shield pharmacy prior authorization process.
